

SPECIAL ADVICE FOR 4WD GUESTS

We greatly value your safety and patronage. For this reason, we want to ensure all guests renting a 4WD from **thl** are fully aware of key safety considerations.

The following points are vital to your safety:

- EPIRB/PLB should be carried with you when you are in a remote location, or you are leaving the vehicle for an extended period of time
- Do not drive at night
- Stay up to date with changing weather conditions and warnings visit www.bom.gov.au
- Be aware road conditions & closures frequently change - tune in to local radio stations (sign posted) or check with local authorities
- Always drive within your capability
- Do not make travel times and distances too excessive
- Adjust gear range and tyre pressure to suit conditions
- Observe safety information stickers in vehicle
- If you are tired, take a break
- Stay on the tracks and report remote travel plans to an official or the nearest police station
- Note the vehicle fuel tank size and travel distances, plan ahead and refuel whenever possible
- In case of a breakdown, for your own safety raise the bonnet up and do not leave your vehicle.
- It's advisable to carry 3 - 4Lt of drinking water per person per day
- Carrying a satellite phone is strongly advised

WRITTEN PERMISSION

is required from **thl** to travel into the areas listed below. Permission to restricted roads will only be granted upon collection of your vehicle, subject to weather conditions, road conditions and road closures.

Clause 14 on your rental agreement

State/Territory	Restricted
All/Various	Any islands with access via ferry, any remote unsealed roads (not already listed), Simpson Desert, Gunbarrel Highway, Tanami Track, Savannah Way from Normanton to Borroloola, Sandover Highway
Queensland	Burke Development Road from Chillilgoe to Normanton, Cape York between 1 June to 30 November (North of Laura/Cooktown), Bloomfield track
South Australia	Oodnadatta Track, Strzelecki Track, Birdsville Track
Tasmania	Tasmania
Western Australia	Bungle Bungles, Gibb River Road, Kalumburu Road, Mitchell Falls/Pifiteau, Goldfields Highway (Wiluna to Meekatharra), Marble Bar Road (Newman to Marble Bar), Ripon Hills Road (Marble Bar to Telfer), Lissadell Road (Warmun to Argyle Diamond Mine) and Duncan Road (Victoria Highway NT side to Halls Creek)
Northern Territory	Arnhem Land, Larapinta Road between Hermannsburg and Petermann, Plenty Highway, Southern Lost City (Limmen National Park), Western Lost City (Limmen National Park), Finke Road (between Alice Springs and Oodnadatta), Chambers Pillar

4WD vehicles are **NOT PERMITTED** in the following areas under any circumstances.

Clause 14 on your rental agreement

State/Territory	Prohibited
All/Various	Any beaches
Queensland	Fraser Island, Moreton Island, Old Telegraph Track section of the road to Cape York, CREB Track, Cape York between 1 December to 31 May, Starcke Track, Frenchman Track
Western Australia	Old Gunbarrel Highway, Canning Stock Route
Northern Territory	Boggy Hole (Finke Gorge National Park), Ghan Heritage Road (from Titjikala to Finke), Central Arnhem Road (past Beswick), Old South Road from Maryvale to Finke

We specifically remind you of your responsibilities under clause 25 of your Rental Agreement, this clause informs you when (irrespective of Liability Option taken) you will NOT be covered.

4WD OPERATION SUMMARY

DO NOT use H4 or L4 position on regular dry paved/sealed roads.

TRANSFER GEAR POSITION

H2-Road Driving : For (normal) driving on regular dry paved roads

H4-Off-Road Driving : For driving ONLY on off road tracks that permit the tyres to slide, such as gravel/dirt/mud/sand

L4-Off-Road Driving : For climbing or descending steep hills (unpaved), off-road driving, and deep sand or mud

TYRE PRESSURE

Tyre pressures should be adjusted to suit the terrain you are driving in. The air compressor located in the vehicle has more details on the recommended PSI levels.

*Remember to re-inflate tyres once finished driving on unsealed roads/mud/sand and when returning to sealed roads.

WATER CROSSINGS - YOU ARE NOT COVERED IRRESPECTIVE OF LIABILITY OPTION TAKEN IF TERMS ARE BREACHED

Fresh water crossings must not be deeper than 30cm or above the height of the driveline (approx. halfway up the tyre), whichever is lower.

The vehicles must not come in contact with salt water. All cost incurred for damage caused by salt water will be at the guests' expense, irrespective of the liability option taken.



HANDY HINTS

- Do not leave devices charging in the cab USB port when the vehicle is parked up, as this draws power from the vehicle battery.
- The fridge is powered by the auxiliary battery (not engine battery) & gets a trickle charge while driving for a decent length of time. Stop start driving is not enough to charge the auxiliary battery.

EPIRB/PLB

- An EPIRB (Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon) or PLB (Personal Locator Beacon) **is designed for use in situations of grave and imminent danger. For example: when there is a life-threatening illness or injury, and you have no other means of communication.**
- Deliberate misuse can result in unnecessary deployment of valuable Search & Rescue resources and could incur a severe penalty.
- If accidentally activated, deactivate the device and call **1800 641 792** or int **+61 2 6230 6811** to report.
